What is Tartan Day?

On April 6, 1320 the Declaration of Arbroath was signed asserting Scotland's sovereignty over England's territorial claims. This commemorates the signing of Scotland's Declaration of Independence. This day is set aside every year by Scottish-Americans to reflect on and celebrate their heritage. This year celebrates the 700th Anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Arbroath.

On March 20, 1998, the US Senate Resolution 155 was passed declaring April 6th as National Tartan Day. Throughout the country, there are festivals and parades celebrating this day.

The members on the St. Andrew's Society of Pittsburgh will host a Tartan Day for visitors on April 4, 2020 between 10:00 AM and 4:30 PM at Bethel Presbyterian Church in Bethel Park, Pennsylvania. The event is free to the public. There will be entertainment from bagpipers, fiddlers, and dancers. Food, raffles, Celtic workshops, and a variety of gifts can be purchased.
